Qualifications for Board of Directors, Genesee Water and Sanitation District

My education focused primarily in geology and hydrogeology, however, environmental-engineering studies at Clemson included extensive coursework in waste-water treatment process design.

Professional experience has included work throughout the Americas and Asia, during which I have drilled, tested, modeled and managed scores of development and reclamation projects. Specific expertise includes analytical and numerical evaluation of fractured-rock aquifers, and design of production water wells. I have evaluated chemical and physical impacts on groundwater and surface-water resources and on riparian environments; written “water” sections of numerous environmental assessments (EAs) and environmental impact statements (EISs); and supervised mitigation and cleanup work at several industrial superfund sites under CERCLA regulations and in communication with USEPA and state departments of environmental quality. I have presented and defended project interests at public hearings, and before permitting agencies, water boards, investor groups, and plaintiff groups.

Serving on the Board of Trustees, Town of Morrison, Colorado, I helped to complete Morrison’s unique water-storage and distribution system (pump-and-store utilizing a private quarry pit), and negotiated with development companies on terms of annexation, and for funds to expand water and sewage systems. I reviewed water-rights assets, and strategic investments in and sales of water and waste-water taps, and interviewed candidates for and hired a water and waste-water facilities manager.
